RIDER / REQUIREMENT'S

Staging:

Stage or riser with a minimum surface area of 12'x24.' If risers are used, it is best to ensure these risers are sturdy without any cracks between the sections and for the riser to be flush up against a wall. If the performance is on the ground floor without a stage it is important that the audience will be able to clearly view the stage area.

Table:

- 1 small table/desk (Like the size of a card table. This is for props)

AV Requirements:

- 1 Lapel Mic (or headset)
- 1 Handheld Mic
- Stage lighting if available
- Projector & Screen
- Sound for computer
- 2 Bottles of water
- 1 Banana per bullying presentation
